
Other news

Church News from Wendy

<u>Easter</u>

At 6.30 a m on Easter morning, 15 of us gathered in the Churchyard at Chapel Chorlton for the usual dawn service for Easter day. In the 40 years that we have been holding 'the Dawn', we have seen all sorts of Easter days – very little rain, it must be said – and this year's was cold and misty. But it was great to meet face-to-face instead of via Zoom. At a more civilised hour, there was a well-attended Zoom service. This month sees 2 meetings with splendidly Anglican names – the 'Annual Parochial Meeting' and the 'Quinquennial'.

The <u>Annual Parochial Meeting</u> is in effect the Church's Annual General Meeting, when a Committee is elected and reports from the Chair, the Treasurer and the Secretary are given . Anyone is welcome to attend this meeting, which usually takes place in church, but of course, this year it will be via Zoom. The date is Wednesday 28th April at 7.30 pm and the Zoom details are the same as for the Sunday service (ID: 885 1942 6344. Passcode: 702395).

<u>Quinquennial.</u> Every parish church has to be inspected by an architect every five years and a detailed report given about the state of the building. St. Peter's, Maer is due to have an inspection this month and let's hope the architect doesn't come up with any shocks!

<u>Church Wall.</u> Despite a hopeful flurry of activity earlier in the Spring, nothing new to report.

<u>Maer Walks.</u> Date to be finalised for this, but likely to be Sat. July 10th – a selection of walks from the Village Hall, village and Church tours, or just come for a Cream Tea.

We hope the Church will be open for worship from the end of May.


Join in for an online virtual version of The Mighty Quiz
